## COACH'S Cambridge Office of Early Childhood Coach's Corner

#### CREATIVE EXPLORATIONS WITH MOVEMENT

#### Dear Educators,

Our March Creative Explorations PLC was dedicated to using **movement** in process-based art and sensory experiences. We shared a magical evening filled with joyful experimentation, collaboration and creativity. We explored with power, speed and motion, noticing the intersecting disciplines (art, geometry and physics), opportunities for schemas and developing learning dispositions. We would like to thank the Harvard Yard Community Children's Center for graciously hosting us!

#### ART AND SENSORY INVITATIONS

#### Ramp painting

We offered tempera paint with golf balls, a wooden ramp lined with paper and added paper on the floor and wall so we could observe the trajectory and impact.

We experimented with the incline of the ramp and were excited to notice the variation in speed and direction and the trail and splash at the bottom.

In your classroom you could use the sensory table's lid, recycled cardboard or gutters for the ramp. You can also experiment with different kinds of balls (tennis, sensory, or dryer balls), with vehicles and even small pumpkins!





#### Large body circle drawing

We offered a large surface of paper and chunky pencils for experimenting with making large with the rotation of our arms. People tried laying on their backs and on their bellies, rolling and alternating sides, alone or navigating the space with a partner. Then one educator thought to offer her skateboard and see how sliding while making marks felt. In your classroom, you could try this in the same way or on a large wall surface using crayons, markers, pencils or even use chalk while outside!

## COACH'S Cambridge Office of Early Childhood Coach's Corner

#### Pendulum Art

We offered a large PVC structure with different options for testing out a pendulum. We took our time to experiment with trajectory and force and started by knowing over magnetic tile structures. We then moved on to mark making and tested out using salt and tempera paint.

This was a collaborative effort which required testing and adjusting. It was fascinating to see the variations based on the angle of the rotation.

In your classroom, there are many ways you can make a simple pendulum. One way is by placing a broomstick between two chairs, securing it with tape, adding string and a paper/cardboard cone with the bottom cut off to make a funnel. Sand, salt, thin paint are all items to explore. Tying a ball to the center string also creates opportunities to explore.

#### Lazy Susan Spin Art

We offered large wooden Lazy Susans with drawing materials and smaller metal ones with colored salt and texture materials.

This was the most soothing experience, lending itself to a relaxing sensory activity and the opportunity for calmer conversation. We noticed variations in speed depending on the resistance caused by the friction of the drawing materials. The smaller ones were faster and lent themselves to smooth out the sand and explore making circles and spirals with the combs and paintbrushes.

You can find Lazy Susan's in second hand stores and in stores with a dedicated houseware section. Perhaps you can try using paint or watercolors?

### A Month to Celebrate Earth



Earth Day is Monday, April 22, 2024, and we can celebrate all month long by introducing key concepts such as planting, composting, and recycling with our young friends. It is a perfect time to raise awareness of protecting our environment and to begin healthy habits in school, at home, and in the community.

- April is a great time to start seeds indoors. Cucumbers, beans, tomatoes, and herbs are easy options to try. The link with instructions for this <u>fun and easy eggshell seed starter activity</u> can be shared with teachers and families!
- Did you know that 40% of household trash consists of compostable food scraps? <u>Learn about composting in Cambridge</u> and how it helps combat climate change (and control rodent activity).
- Birds play an important role in our ecosystem and need nutrition, too. This <u>shareable</u>, <u>printable activity from NASA</u> uses cookie cutters, seeds, and gelatin to create bird feeders in fun shapes.
